

MINUTES OF THE CITY OF HULL MAYOR AND COUNCIL

June 16, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Mayor John Barber at 7:00 p.m. at Hull City Hall. Those in attendance in addition to the Mayor were the Clerk, and council members Mike McElroy, Yvonne Davenport, Paige Phillips and Steven Hollingsworth and City Attorney Danny Love. Also present was Oden Bullock with Athens Christmas Lights.

A moment of silent prayer followed the pledge of allegiance.

The minutes of the May meeting were unanimously approved after a motion by Paige Phillips and a second by Mike McElroy. The financial reports were unanimously approved after a motion by Yvonne Davenport and a second by Steven Hollingsworth.

Under old business, Oden Bullock with Athens Christmas Lights presented some information and pricing for what his company offered with respect to decorating the City of Christmas. No action was taken.

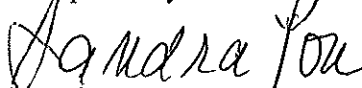
City Attorney, Danny Love, spoke to a previous inquiry about a zoning matter and the placement of a tiny house or camper on a piece of property in the City. Attorney Love also discussed the Application for Re-Zoning document he was working on with respect to this or future request to re-zone. Copies will be distributed to Mayor and Council via email once the document is in final form. Attorney Love also discussed the procedure and potential costs to the landowner with respect to the application.

Mayor Barber presented the Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and County with respect to future payments and allowable projects in the event the SPLOST is approved by vote in November. After review a motion was made by Mike McElroy, seconded by Steven Hollingsworth and unanimously approved for the Mayor and Clerk to sign the Agreement and transmit to the County.

Under new business Mayor Barber requested that he be allowed to purchase a laptop for his use for city business. The cost will be \$1,799.89 from Phillips Solutions which includes the laptop and set up. Motion was made by Mike McElroy, seconded by Yvonne Davenport and unanimously approved to allow Mayor Barber to purchase the laptop.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned after a motion by Mike McElroy and a second by Paige Phillips.
