

## Summary of January 22, 2026 Council Meeting

Mayor and Council met for its regular meeting on Thursday, January 22, 2026. The Mayor and all council members were present in addition to the Clerk and City Attorney. Also present was building inspector Mr. Shedd and Anna Izquierdo from the Madison County Journal along with members of Hull Baptist Church, Charles Dooley, Don Tyson and Pastor Tinsley.

Prior to the meeting the Clerk administered the oath to council members, Mike McLeroy and Steven Hollingsworth for their new term which began January 1<sup>st</sup>.

The minutes and financial reports were approved as presented.

Mr. Dooley along with Mr. Tyson spoke to the idea of the City and the Hull Baptist Church sharing the costs to install lights at the walking track so that it could be used by church members and city residents. The church will obtain some costs proposal and get back with the City.

Appointments were made for Voter Registrar; City Clerk; and City Attorney. Steven Hollingsworth was elected Mayor Pro Tem.

The City voted to purchase new Christmas Decorations for the light poles from Mosca Designs; The Clerk reported that the 2023 audit and report had been completed and submitted and Letters of Engagement were approved for the 2024 audit.

A new contract was approved for GreenScenez to continue lawn maintenance for the City. The new contract will run from February 1, 2026, through November 30, 2026, and the contract was expanded to add trimming of the crepe myrtles and would allow more time to maintain the medians and the flower beds on the side of Highway 72.

Mayor Barber presented an estimate from Melton Services, LLC to remodel the office area at City Hall for a cost of \$11,000.00 to be paid from the Construction Account at Commercial Bank.

Mr. Shedd reported that he had permitted two homes on Glenn Carrie Road.

There was no other business and the meeting was adjourned.
